

## “He’s Alive...”

It is amazing how songs affect our lives. When it comes to the above topic there are many choices of songs that sometimes become a part of our inner being. One such song for me is quite traditional at Easter time. That song is “*He Lives.*” A portion of that song goes like this; “*He walks with me and talks with me along life’s narrow way. You ask me how I know he lives; he lives within my heart.*” Unfortunately, for a lot of people this is not true. May I share a few thoughts with you for just a moment?

Have you ever been in a position where you have witnessed something and your immediate response is I can’t believe what I just saw. You saw it with your own eyes and still you can’t believe. Illusionists can put most of us in that frame of mind. But remember, you saw it and you could not believe. Did your eyes trick you or.....? That is exactly what an illusion is. One’s eyes and mind are tricked for a period of time. You know what I am talking about. Witnessing a person being cut in half and separating the parts of their bodies and watching their hands and toes move. Or, a person in a box and a bunch of sharp spears shoved through the box and when the box is open...well, the spears you see but the person is gone. Were the people of Jesus time tricked? Certainly not, especially the Romans who crucified him. You are on a cross for hours, your body is pierced with a spear and you die. Roman soldiers were not in the habit of taking people off a cross until they were dead. Jesus was dead. That was no illusion. He was put in a tomb and the tomb was sealed. Roman soldiers guarded the tomb. As far as the Romans were concerned the body of Jesus was destined to be in one place after the death on a cross and that place was a tomb. And that is exactly where he was until .....

Have you ever had to testify in court as a witness? I did once and let me tell you that is something you do not forget. It also makes you very aware of how a part of our judicial system works. And before one testifies, hand placed on the Bible and another hand raised and “Do you swear to tell the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth, so help you God?” The truth. Paul writes that Jesus appeared to five hundred people at one time and further stated that if one did not believe him, he told them to go talk to these who were witnesses. And we have historical evidence, written documents by those who were recording history as it occurred verifying Jesus walking again on this earth, preaching, teaching and healing **after** his death.
